Progress in Quantum Well and Dot Lasers

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Yasuhiko Arakawa received his BE, ME, and PhD degree in Electronics and Electrical Engineering from the University of Tokyo in 1975, 1977 and 1980, respectively. In 1980, he joined the University of Tokyo as an assistant professor and became a full professor in 1993. He is currently the director of Research Center for Photonics Electronics Convergence, Institute of Industrial Science and the director of Institute for Nano Quantum Information Electronics, the University of Tokyo. He served as a member of Science Council of Japan (2008-2014), a project leader of FIRST Program (2011-2014), and the President of International Commission of Optics (ICO) (2014-2017). He received several major awards including Leo Esaki Award (2004), IEEE/LEOS William Streifer Award (2004), Fujiwara Award (2007), Prime Minister Award (2007), Medal with Purple Ribbon (2009), IEEE David Sarnoff Award (2009), C&C Award (2010), Welker Award (2011), and OSA Nick Holonyak Jr. Award (2011).
